

Kingdom Aviation Report

July- August 2018

One Arm Point: This week Matt & I went to this community and spent the first part of the morning in a grade 1 & 2 class and an older class. The teachers here had their hands full in both situations and we came away with a renewed respect for the work of these teachers. After the students went for morning tea, it was our turn to walk around the community and encourage some of the fellow Christians living and working there. So often it is we who are blessed by these times together. We then spent a bit of time down on the beach having lunch, what a glorious view, God's beautiful creation spread out before us. After that we were back to the school for the program which is run directly after school. This day about 14 or 15 young enthusiastic students turned up. The day rounded off with a Bible study in the chapel. Sometimes several residents will attend but this day just saw I wonderful Christian lady come and we shared time together.

Ngalapita- It has been a joy to fly out to this school and share with both the children and the staff. Although numbers of children vary from week to week- sometimes just 3 and other times there may be 8 or 9, the children are receptive and eager to listen to the story and participate in games. The 3 staff members are extremely friendly and it is a chance for them to share with someone else the highs and lows of their week in the community. As well as doing the program the KA staff help in the classroom or help in any outdoor activities eg sweeping paths, tidying sheds or putting out play equipment for the junior children.

Djugeriri – At this school the program is delivered to a small number from 3 – 6 who are excited to remember that it is Tuesday and that means KAM. Once again the staff are very welcoming and go out of their way to pick us up from the airstrip and drop us back to the plane. One week this term we went out into the community for the end of NAIDOC week celebrations and were able to meet other people as well.

Wananami- 27 students were listening to the program (29/8/18) and the Principal is eager for this to happen each week. Once again odd jobs are done in class or around the school to help staff members and build relationships.



Looma - During our visits to Looma, we have formed relationships with several staff members and presented to 2 different class groups. The older high school students are respectful and listen to the program and we count it a privilege to be able to share God's

word with them. There are usually 7-8 in this group. The younger students from Year 6-7 (14-15 pupils) are an energetic and lively bunch who once again listen and participate in the program. Whilst the children are listening to the program, so too are the staff members and a softening has been observed in their attitudes during recent weeks. One staff member agreed to be prayed for and another one has allowed us to pray openly for her class.

Yakanarra: This school is visited every Thursday, for the first few weeks this term, Matt and Terry flew out to here, but after the return of the Cessna, then Matt has flown Tracey to Fitzroy Crossing before flying onto Yakanarra with Roslyn. We run the program 2 times at this school, once with the very young children and then with the middle age junior school kids and the high school kids together. Normally there would be well over 20 kids in attendance in total. It has been a joy to not only encourage the kids but also to build relationships with the staff.
